



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This year has been a time of uncertainty and difficulty for all of us. The pandemic brought on fear, isolation, and disruption in our lives. We are fortunate that tennis is one of the few activities that was determined to be safe, and the club was able to operate during this period, although with some government imposed restrictions. Tennis has provided all of us with a much needed opportunity for exercise and activity during this period.

The board of directors, with the help of many dedicated volunteers, has been hard at work to improve our club. The following are some highlights of the improvements that have been implemented:

- on-line reservation system
- new website
- pro shop refurbishing
- creation of a budget committee and a budget
- replacement of the lights

In addition, we are about to start repair work on the walls at court 9, and the resurfacing of courts 2 and 7-9.

The pro shop work was accomplished on a small budget by a large group of very dedicated volunteers. The transformation is amazing – if you haven't been in yet go take a look. A big thank you to everyone that helped on this project.

These positive changes have benefited the club in several ways. We have the highest number of members that we have had in years – currently 804, compared to around 450 to 500 for the last several years. We are also experiencing a large increase in income from the pro shop. Collectively, income from shop sales, ball machine rental, and daily fees is up over 376% compared to previous years.

After a hiatus forced upon us by the Covid pandemic, we welcomed the return of spectators at the 105th Annual La Jolla Championships. We are also looking forward to holding the fall club tournament as usual, and to the Summer Social event.

Thank you to all of the volunteers who have helped in so many ways. With this support, the club has a great future ahead.



FINANCIAL UPDATE



Our account balance as of 8/31/21 was \$163,351, \$40,000 of which is held in reserves. Since the restructuring of our club, beginning May 1, 2021, we continue to see a dramatic increase in revenue each month. Even with the added operational costs of our new court reservation system, Quickbooks Online, website, and other subscriptions that allow us to operate more efficiently, our year to date expenses are down 18% and our net income is up 376% from 2019. A comparison from 2020 was not done due to COVID-19 closures/restrictions imposed on the club. Overall, the club is in great financial position to continue to make improvements keeping the club in excellent condition as required by our Special Use Permit. Projecting that our net income stays the course, the Finance Committee (Bob Brobst, Charlie Hein and myself) will propose a 2022 budget that will allow for continued improvements to be made to be enjoyed by all of our members.
